Overview

China's growing dependence on imported oil and gas has made energy security a central national concern. To reduce vulnerability, Beijing has diversified through global investment, with Africa becoming a key frontier thanks to its abundant hydrocarbons and exceptional renewable. China has emerged as a pivotal partner in addressing Africa's critical energy infrastructure gap, with over 600 million people on the continent—primarily in sub-Saharan Africa—lacking electricity access. This report examines Chinese-backed energy projects in Africa from 2020 to 2024, highlighting. Sub-Saharan Africa is home to nearly 80% of the world's population without access to electricity, yet in 2022, the continent received only 1% of global renewable energy. Addressing Africa's energy challenges and accelerating its transition to a low-carbon, climate-resilient economy are crucial for.
