Overview

China is adding more solar and wind power to its energy grid than any other economy – but that huge buildout has its challenges. Here's what we can learn. China's approach to renewable energy buildout combines large-scale investment, technological innovation and market reform. How China overcomes market, financing and systemic challenges holds. China is the largest market in the world for both photovoltaics (PV) and solar thermal energy. Its PV capacity crossed 1,000 gigawatt (one terawatt, 1 TW) in May 2025. By connection type, on-grid installations led with 90. Rapid solar capacity expansion overwhelms the grid, PV manufacturers compete for market shares, and then large target markets slap import tariffs on Chinese PV products, taking off their competitive edge. Currently, China manufactures over 80% of the world's solar panels.
