

Tajikistan solar-powered communication cabinet wind power standards



Overview

Concrete projects in solar and wind power have already begun, with plans in motion to fully reach the 3,000 MW target by 2030. Tajikistan is gearing up for a major clean-energy transformation, aiming to produce 3,000 MW of electricity from solar and wind plants by 2030. Organized by the Ministry of Energy and Water Resources of Tajikistan, the country's National Academy of Sciences and the Association of Renewable Energy Sources of Tajikistan, a three-day regional conference entitled "Prospects for Renewable Energy Development in Tajikistan" kicked off in Dushanbe. Tajikistan's theoretical hydropower potential is estimated at over 527 billion kWh annually—enough to meet Central Asia's energy consumption three times over. The Roghun Hydropower Project is the centerpiece of Tajikistan's energy strategy. The country has set an ambitious goal to add 3,000 megawatts (MW) of solar and wind power, a move that will not only dramatically boost its renewable energy production network – technical means for transmission and distribution of electric and thermodynamic acts of the Republican and administrative measures aimed at encouraging production and use of renewable energy wood, biomass as manufacturing, municipal and houses may also be used for other purposes in.
