Nevertheless, Thailand's decarbonisation commitments in its Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) under the Paris Agreement have triggered new rounds of renewable energy deployment, with over eight GWp of greenfield wind and solar projects announced or in the procurement pipeline.
